CORPORATION SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER TWO

In 1885 the legislature provided that all school districts should be combined into one town school district. Theretofore each district school house had been paid for by a tax on the property in its district, and to equalize the cost throughout the town the new law provided that the selectmen should appraise the value of each schoolhouse, assess the total value against all the taxable property in town and proportionately credit the property in each district with the value of its schoolhouse.

District No. Two had built an expensive building, with a public assembly room (Union Hall) in the second story. The selectmen took the ground that no credit should be allowed for Union Hall, cannily expecting that this would become the property of the town without cost since it seemed improbable that the "hole in the wall" would have any value. But Dr. O. H. Bradley, Peter Upton, James S. Lacy and other prominent citizens of East Jaffrey thought otherwise. They secured from the legislature a charter for "Corporation School District No. 2," which authorized all citizens in that area to own Union Hall.

This arrangement continued for some years with frequent arguments between town school authorities and corporation officials as to repairs to the walls around and the roof over Union Hall. In 1907 additional school room being required, the town school district voted to build a one-story annex, at the same time authorizing the corporation to insert an extra story between the first story and the roof if it so desired. This was done, the corporation borrowing for the purpose with the expectation that repayment could be made from hall rentals. Revenue proving insufficient for more than carrying charges, in 1911 and 1912 a special tax was assessed against property in District No. Two. This proved unpopular and in 1913 the corporation voted to assign all its rights to the town school district on condition that the balance of the construction note be assumed. This arrangement was consummated and an anomalous situation ended.
