EXTRACT FROM CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE V.

Clause 2.—Resident members shall pay an initiation fee of five dollars for the first year and annual dues of three dollars for each succeeding year.

Clause 3.—Any member by payment of fifty dollars is exempt from future annual dues. (*Note—Payment for life membership is fifty-five dollars, i. e. five dollars for initiation fee and fifty dollars for future annual dues.*)

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION

The Council recommends that the Membership approve the following changes to the Club Constitution at the Club's Annual Meeting to be held at the Harvard Club of Boston at 8:15 p.m. on May 24, 2005.

Article III.6

Associates are those full-time students undergraduates of colleges and universities who have been elected as associates because of their interest in the object of the Club. Upon graduation they may be elected regular members in the usual way.

Article V.2(c)

Currently reads: Honorary members are exempt from dues.

Eliminate this Article entirely, while grandfathering those who are already Honorary Members. The Council has voted that upon passage of this Amendment, Standing Rule 4 is modified to read:

Dues of Club Medalists, and of Honorary Members awarded prior to May 2005, shall be remitted.

Article V.2(d)

Change from:
Life membership shall be \$1000, the income only to be expended.

to:
Members with at least 10 years membership are eligible for Life Membership, which shall cost 10 times the Annual Dues of Resident Members at the time of payment. These payments shall remain segregated, except that one tenth of the aggregate amount plus interest shall be paid into the Club operating account annually.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION

The Council recommends that the Membership approve the following changes to the Club Constitution at the Club's Annual Meeting to be held at the Harvard Club of Boston at 8:15 p.m. on May 20, 2008.

Articles V.2(a) & (b) currently read:

- (a) Initiation fee shall be \$100, payable within sixty days of notification.
- (b) Annual dues shall be \$100 for Resident Members and \$50 for Non-Resident Members and Associates, payable in advance.

Change these to read:

- (a) An initiation fee shall be equal to one year of Resident Member dues, and shall be paid within sixty days of notification. Associate members shall be exempt from this fee.
- (b) Annual dues shall be \$120 for Resident Members and one-half of that amount for Non-Resident and Associate Members, and shall be paid by the first meeting of the Club year.

Add a new clause V.2(d):

- (d) Annual dues not paid in full by the January meeting shall be subject to a twenty-five percent surcharge.

Next year the prices of dinners and annual dues will both have to be increased. The Council sets dinner prices. Annual dues are set by the membership as a whole through an amendment of the Constitution. This letter describes the facts leading to the dinner and annual dues increases.

Annual dues were last raised in 2001, and dinner prices were last raised (by \$5) in 2005. Since then the Harvard Club has substantially increased the price they charge us for dinners and the fee they impose for our use of the Massachusetts Room. For the past two years the actual cost of a dinner has been \$50. That price has been subsidized from the Club's reserve and from dues, so you have been paying only \$35 for members and \$45 for guests. The room charge has been \$835 per meeting, and includes the room, two bartenders, a cashier, and audiovisual equipment. This fee is included as part of your dues. Next year we will be getting another price increase from the Harvard Club. Their dinner price to us will be \$54.18, and room fee will be \$935 per meeting. These Harvard Club increases have forced our hand. The \$35 dinner price is no longer tenable.

The HTC Council has, therefore, voted to raise the dinner price for members and guests, and to recommend a raise in the dues to cover the increased room fee and other expenses. The Council has further decided that there should be no subsidy built into the price of dinners – members and guests alike should pay the full cost of a dinner. Therefore, effective next year, the dinner price will be \$55 for both members and guests. In addition, the Council is also recommending that annual dues be increased by twenty dollars, to \$120 for resident members and \$60 for non-resident and associate members. This is a modest increase in dues, but we believe it will cover the anticipated increases in expenses. Our goal is to hold both the annual dues and the dinner price at the above figures for three years.

The Harvard Club has agreed to fix their new fee structure for the next two years. That means that their dinner price and the room fee will not change for two years. Our other expenses (e.g. postage, printing, and speaker expenses) will, however, go up yearly due to inflation. In determining the new dinner price of \$55 we have taken into account the Harvard Club's two-year fixed price, and included a seven percent inflation factor for the third year. Similarly, we applied that inflation factor to the room fee for the third year, and to our regular on-going expenses for each of the next three years. Based on reasonable assumptions and on those calculations, it should be possible to hold dinner prices and annual dues constant for the next three years. Of course, we can't guarantee that will happen, but we are about as confident as one can be when making financial extrapolations from previous years' expenses.

We recognize that there will undoubtedly be a certain amount of "sticker shock", given that we have held off increasing prices for so long. A \$20 increase in dinner prices for members, and \$10 for guests, is a noticeable increase. On the other hand, \$55 is competitive with prices in Boston at both private clubs and restaurants, especially given that you can also attend a fine cocktail hour and a first-class travel presentation.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION

The Council recommends that the Membership approve the following changes to the Club Constitution at the Club's Annual Meeting to be held at the Harvard Club of Boston at 8:00 p.m. on May 15, 2012.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS AND GOVERNMENT

Currently reads:

1. The officers of the Club shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, Secretary-Treasurer, and five Councillors. At least one Councillor shall be elected each year and none shall serve more than five years. These officers shall constitute a Council, which shall have complete charge of the affairs of the Club.

Change to read:

1. The Club shall be governed by a nine-member Council, which shall have charge of the affairs of the Club.
2. Officers of the Club shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, one Secretary-Treasurer or one Secretary and one Treasurer, plus Councillors.
3. When there is a combined Secretary-Treasurer, the number of Councillors shall be five. When there is one Secretary and a separate Treasurer, the number of Councillors shall be four.
4. At least one Councillor shall be elected each year, and none shall serve for more than five consecutive years.

ARTICLE X: AMENDMENTS

Currently reads:

1. The Constitution may be amended or changed by a four-fifths vote of the Council approved by a two-thirds vote of the Annual Meeting; all amendments to appear in the call for the meeting.

Change to read:

1. The Constitution may be amended or changed by a two-thirds vote of the Council, approved by a two-thirds vote of the membership at the Annual Meeting; all amendments to appear in the call for the meeting.

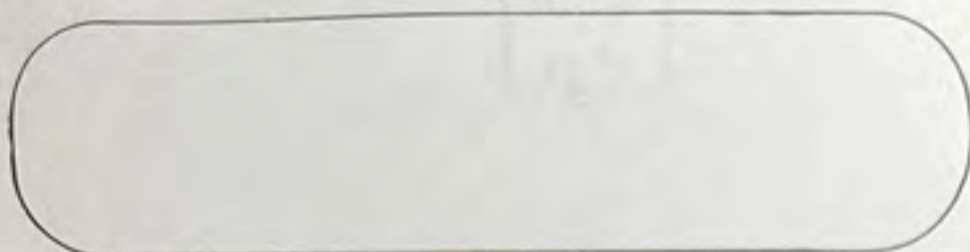

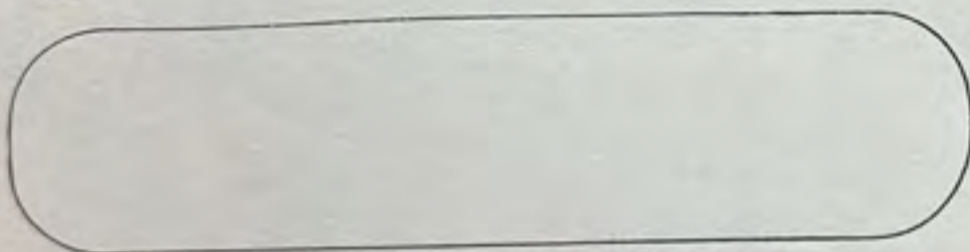
